You will use three different software programs in this course:

- 1. **MyLabIT** from the textbook publisher Pearson
- 2. Microsoft Word 2019 for PCs
- 3. **Blackboard** the LMS (Learning Management System) used by South Plains College

It is the responsibility of the student to make sure that he/she has the necessary computer resources, skills, and prerequisite to take this class. You MUST use Microsoft Office 2019/365 since all work is based on this software. Although we primarily use Word 2019, a few assignments utilize Excel and Access.

In order to access the course, a Web browser is necessary. **Chrome** is strongly recommended. **You will need to allow pop-ups for the MyLabIT site.**

Block or allow pop-ups in Chrome

By default, Google Chrome prevents pop-ups from automatically appearing and cluttering your screen. You can turn the pop-up blocker on or off. When it's on and a pop-up is blocked, the address bar will show a pop-up blocker icon.

Internet Explorer (IE) should not be used.

Course Structure

This course is an online course, which means that you will access course information and respond to me through the use of the Internet. Blackboard and Pearson's **MyLabIT** are used to deliver and manage this course. Please take a moment to read over the information at the Blackboard site before you get started. If the online environment is new to you or if you have problems of any nature, please do not let yourself become overwhelmed or spend hours of your time trying to figure out how to access something. You have many sources available to you for help. You can contact me by e-mail, telephone, or come by my office.

Attendance Policy

The grade of "F" will be assigned to a student as an earned grade in regard to the learning objectives of a course. A student who does not meet the attendance requirements of a class as stated in the course syllabus, and does not officially withdraw from that course by the official census date of the semester, may be administratively withdrawn from that course and receive a grade of "X" as determined by the instructor. An "F" will not be assigned to any student administratively withdrawn from this course for non-attendance. It is the student's responsibility to be aware of that policy.

An "F" may be assigned to a student in the case of academic dishonesty and/or plagiarism at the discretion of the instructor, as clearly defined in the course syllabus, due to the severity of the student's actions and disregard for the learning objectives of the course.

Should a student, for any reason, delay in reporting to a class after official enrollment, absences will be attributed to the student from the first-class meeting.

Students who enroll in a course but have never attended by the official census date, as reported by the faculty member, will be administratively dropped by the Office of Admissions and Records.

Even though this is an online class, students still have to access the course on a regular basis. The Blackboard software used to manage this online course tracks student logins, tracking when and where the student has been in the course. Accessing this course on a regular basis is extremely important in order to meet the objectives of this course. You will feel more at ease with the materials if you stay in touch with what is going on. **You will need to check your SPC e-mail at https://office.com.**

Minimum log in for the course is at least three (3) days per week. However, I recommend checking in once a day if possible for announcements. I can see how many times you log in!

You may work on this class 24/7. That's the advantage of an online class.

A student is clear to return to class without further assessment from DeEtte Edens, BSN, RN if they have completed the 5-day isolation period, symptoms have improved, and they are without fever for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medication.

Students must communicate with DeEtte Edens, BSN, RN prior to their return date if still symptomatic at the end of the 5-day isolation.

Withdrawal Policy

It is the student's responsibility to verify administrative drops for excessive absences through MySPC using his or her student online account. If it is determined that a student is awarded financial aid for a class or classes in which the student never attended or participated, the financial aid award will be adjusted in accordance with the classes in which the student did attend/participate and the student will owe any balance resulting from the adjustment.

If for any reason the student is unable to complete the course requirements, it is the student's responsibility to initiate their own withdrawal by the 1st drop date for the semester. If your average is below 60 when you drop, you will receive an F in the course. An administrative drop by the instructor in this course will, in most cases, result in the student receiving an "F" (not an "X"). The last day to drop a class is April 27, 2023. However, always discuss this with your instructor before dropping.

You must complete the problems in the order they are presented. The assignments are in sequential modules. You must make at least a 70 on each assignment or attempt it three times before the next assignment will open. However, if you make an 80 on the first attempt, you still have two more attempts to make a better grade. I would strive for at least a 90 on each assignment. Remember, you want to master the material, not just get through it.

Final grades will be based on the following grading scale:

90-100=A, 80-89=B, 70-79=C, 60-69=D, Below 60=F

Your grades will be found in the Blackboard grade book under My Grades.

Assignment Policy

Assignments will be shown in MyLablT. Problems that are not turned in will be assigned a grade of 0. All deadlines will be on Sunday night at 11:59 PM. I do not accept late work after this deadline. Do not wait until Sunday night to start your work. When you are given two weeks for most deadlines, you should try to finish at least 50% of the assignment in the first week of the allowed time and 50% in the second week. This allows you to retain the information.

Communication with instructor

- 1. Log in at least three (3) times a week (minimum). I recommend daily logins.
- 2. Check for announcements/mail in Blackboard—this is your responsibility. If you don't check in frequently, you may miss important information regarding your schedule, work, or grades.
- 3. Start work early in each week. Don't wait until the due date to start your work. When you do, something always happens like an illness or an unexpected problem. Remember, no time extensions can be given.





Answers to Your Frequently Asked Questions About Using MyLabIT

What is MyLabIT?

The abbreviation *IT* (pronounced EYE-TEE) is commonly used in organizations to mean *Information Technology*. The IT Department is typically charged with managing all of the computer hardware and software in an organization.

MyLabIT (pronounced MY-EYE-TEE-LAB) is a web-based program where you can practice Microsoft Office applications, access exercises related to important computer concepts, and take tests that your instructor will assign. It is your online lab for learning about IT—Information Technology.

Am I required to purchase a textbook?

No, that's up to you. You receive an online version of the text when you participate in the TexBook program. You may buy a hard copy text through the publisher if that's what you want.
